

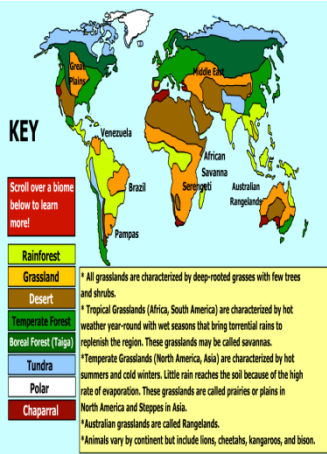

1	Parts of speech adjective- a word that describes a noun noun- a thing verb- a doing word adverb- a word that describes a verb Use this information to create 4 word phrases going through the alphabet, using alliteration. Use the parts of speech in order as shown. eg Angry apes attack aggressively Big baboons bounce badly Cute cats cuddle carefully You can write some amusing phrases. Try to go through the whole alphabet.	Number Make cards for each number 0-9. You can use scrap paper if you do not have other paper. Place the cards face down. Turn over 2, 3 or 4 cards. Write down all the different numbers you can make. Repeat this 5 times. Look carefully at the place value of each digit. eg If I turn over 1,2,3 I would write 12 123 13 132 and so on 21 23 31 32 Organise your work systematically. Extension: Put the numbers you have made in order from the smallest to the largest.	Sound Rice on a drum Place paper over a tub and fix it in place with a rubber band. Tap your drum. What do you feel? Hear? Now place some rice on the top and tap the drum. What happens to the rice? What causes this to happen? Clue: vibrations

2	Similes A simile is a phrase that describes something by comparing it to something else using like or as Look at your map and try to write a simile for each item eg The palm trees were like giant pineapples. The sea was as blue as a clear summer sky.	Number Use your cards for each number 0-9. Place the cards face down. Turn over 2, 3 or 4 cards. Write down the addition calculations you can make. Repeat this 5 times. eg If you turn over 1,2,3 You can write $1+2=3 \qquad 12+3=15$ $1+3=4 \qquad 13+2=15 \text{ and so on.}$ $2+3=5$ Look carefully at the place value of each digit. Look for patterns in your calculations. Extension: Check your answers by using the inverse eg $3-1=2$ $3-2=1$	Global Warming Use the internet to find images of different habitats. 4	Now choose your own style of poem. There are many examples on the internet if you search poetry for KS2. Look at How to write a poem BBC BITESIZE. You could write: -another acrostic poem -a rhyming poem but make sure that it makes sense -a narrative poem using your ideas from your magical land	Write out a times table of your choice onto cards putting the questions and answers onto different cards ie 1×8 on one card and 8 on another card. Now shuffle the cards and place them face down on your table in 4 rows with 6 in each column. With your siblings or your carers play the Memory Game. Take it in turns to turn over 2 cards. If you have a matching pair you keep the cards and have another turn. If you do not have a matching pair replace the cards making sure you put them back in the same place. Remember what you turned over because it will help you on future turns. Good luck and have fun. Extension: Create more cards for other times tables and challenge yourself.
